COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Bata de Cola - The **Intermediate** bata de cola class is for students with at least three years of flamenco training and focuses on the techniques involved in working with the bata de cola (dress with a train) as well as strengthening the specific parts of the body that are required for smooth maneuverability. Introduction of either a mantón or abanico solidifies the lines, balance, coordination, etc. A bata de cola is required for the class. The **Beginner** course is for students with a minimum of two years of flamenco training. The **Introduction** explores the bata de cola's unique qualities to understand the balance, strength and alignment required for proper and safe maneuverability.

Bulerías - The *bulerías* occupy a special and supreme position in the world of flamenco, constantly undergoing change and wide open to spontaneity. The course focuses on dancing to the *cante*, finding an individual style and building confidence in improvisation as well as mastering the cues to the singer and guitarist for smooth transition into various segments of the dance.

Castanets - The castanet courses focus on learning the proper technique for playing this percussive instrument including correct posture, arm, hand and finger exercises, learning the various tones and *toques* as well as learning a short 'score' to play.

Cante - The *cante* classes are designed to help students understand the basic structures of various *cante* forms and to sing them. Singing is a very useful tool for dancers to understand how to dance to the *cante* verses. With handouts of verses, discussions and practical exercises, dancers and non-dancers develop a greater understanding and appreciation of the *cante's* importance in flamenco. Basic knowledge of flamenco dance and Spanish language is an asset.

Danza Española - Spanish Classical Dance involves the use of castanets and is based upon principles of classical ballet imbued with the Iberian temperament making it unique to Spain. Positioning, balance and coordination are strongly emphasized. Spanish Classical Dance ranges from a very balletic style known as *escuela bolera* danced in soft shoe to a more contemporary style danced in flamenco shoes also known as *danza estilizada*.

Flamenco - Flamenco classes explore the techniques of footwork, arm and hand movements, as well as the *cante*, rhythm and structure for choreography. A complete choreography is obtained to one *palo* (rhythm) before exploring another. The **Introduction** course explores basic techniques and rhythms to give the student a sampling of flamenco's variety.

Jota - The Jota is a Spanish genre of music and dance that exists throughout Spain, but whose origins lie in the Spanish region of Aragón. Dating back to the 18th century, the Jota Aragonesa is the most celebrated form of folkloric expression today. Soft soled shoes required for this class.

Sevillanas - Sevillanas has its origins as a court dance and therefore has a set choreography. It is extremely popular in all of Andalucía and is danced with a partner. Level I introduces the four verses that comprise the dance and Level II develops more intricate partnering patterns involving more dancers.

Tangos por Fiesta - As in the *bulerías* class, the objective is to understand the tangos dance form and the interplay between dancer, singer, guitarist and *palmas* and to improvise using simple steps to build confidence.

Technique - Technique classes are ongoing and can be used as drop-in classes. Various techniques used in flamenco dance are examined and strengthened such as turns, footwork, *braceo* and *palmas*. The summer course is also a boot camp to introduce various props such as the *abanico*, *mantón* and *bastón*. Precision and clarity are emphasized.
